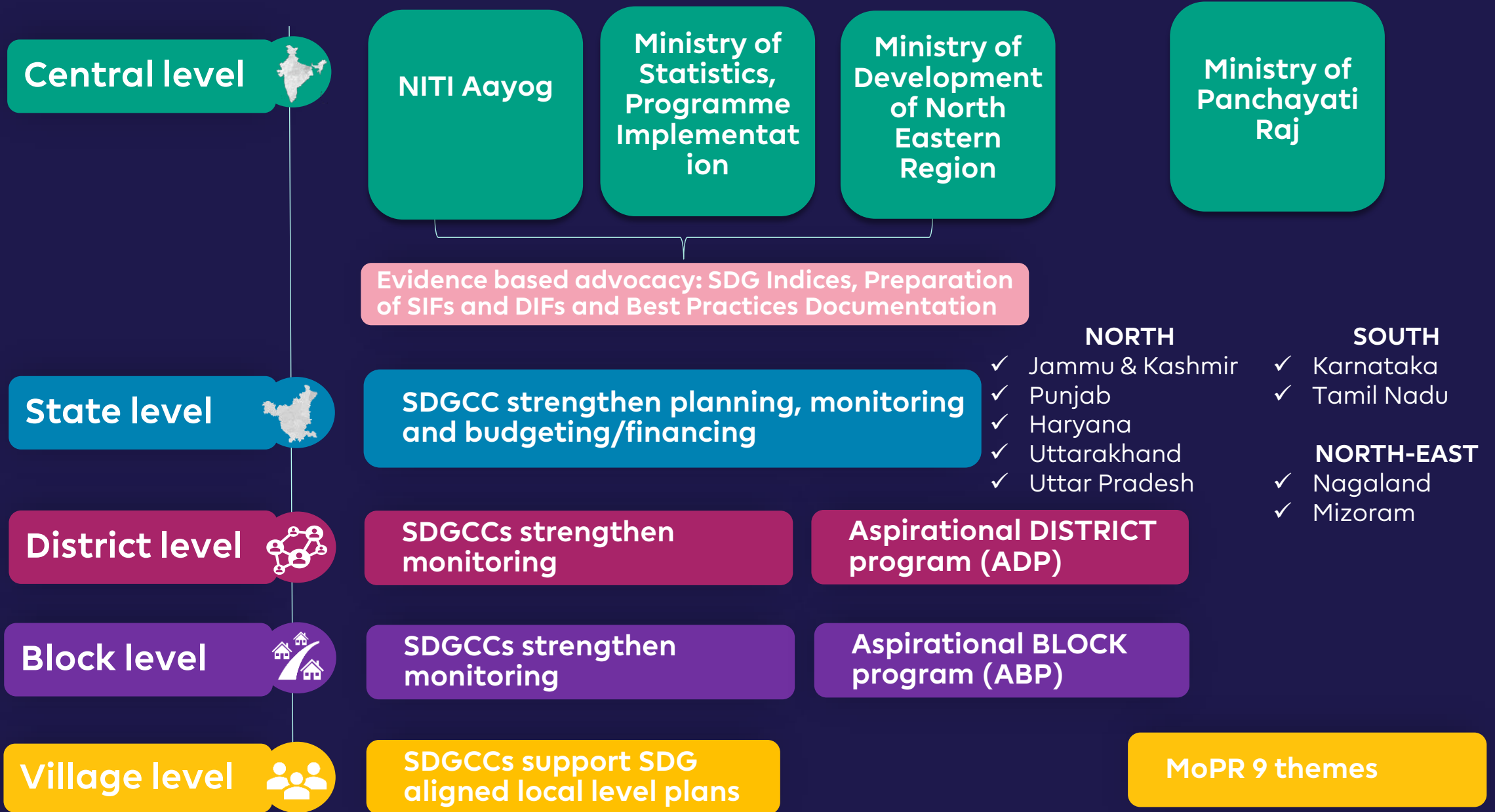




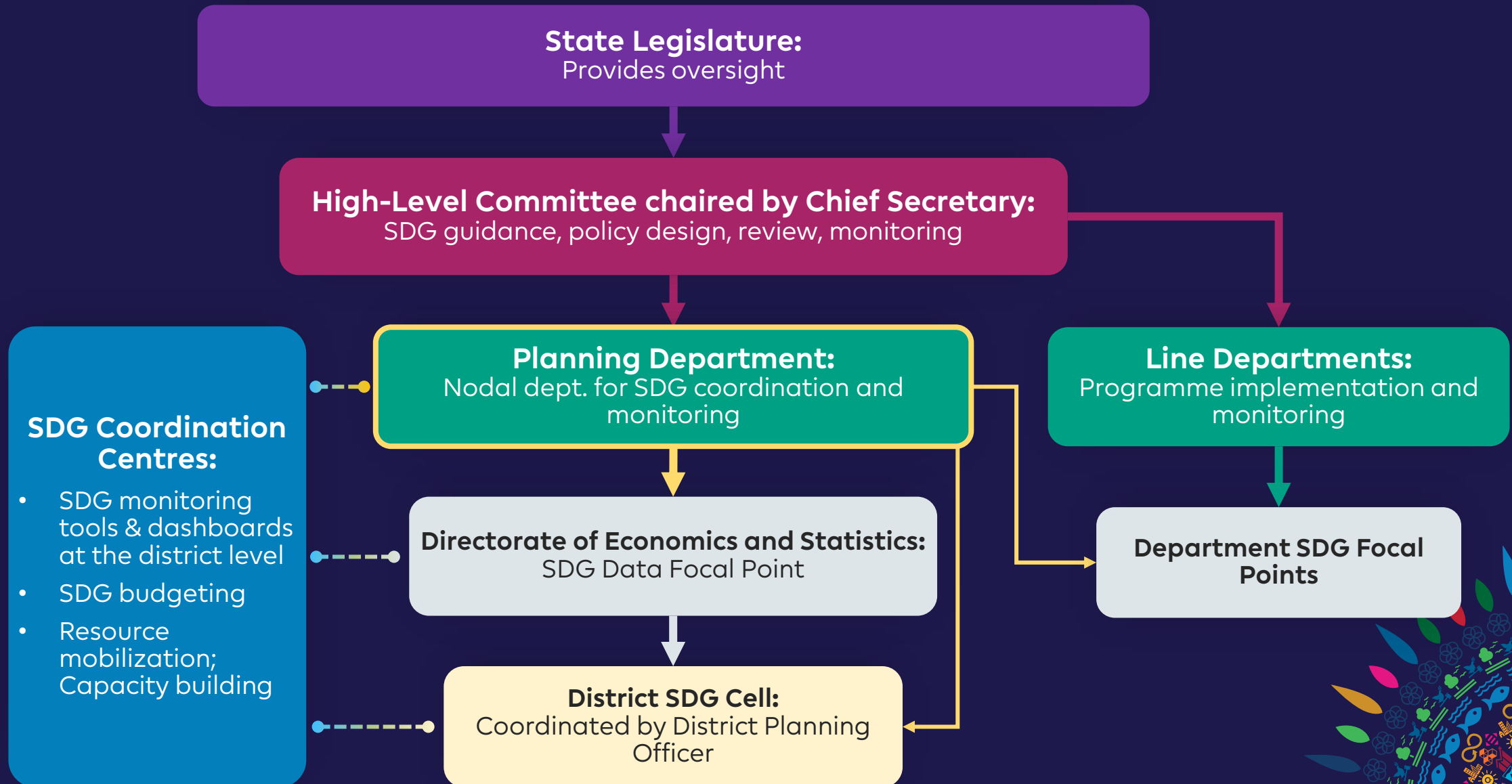

# SDG Coordination Centres (SDGCC)

## An Introduction

Dedicated technical cell established within Planning Department of the State/UT for aligning planning and monitoring process with SDGs, acting as a secretariat for SDG actions, in partnership with UNDP

Currently funded through State level budgets/Support to Statistical Strengthening Scheme for States, promoting ownership and accountability

The SDGCC approach was initiated in 2018, with the first SDGCC established in Haryana by UNDP

Expanded the scope of Planning Departments **beyond traditional functions**, fostering innovation and strategic development.

Ensured **SDGs are seen as opportunities** for sustainable growth **rather than burden**, providing necessary support to states

Enhanced coordination and informed decision-making by **addressing knowledge gaps** at the state level

Established a robust understanding and **ownership of SDGs across all state departments**

**Strengthened capacities** at every level to ensure effective on-the-ground outcomes

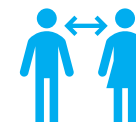

SDGCCs increased stakeholder awareness and ownership, speeding up SDG localization at local levels.

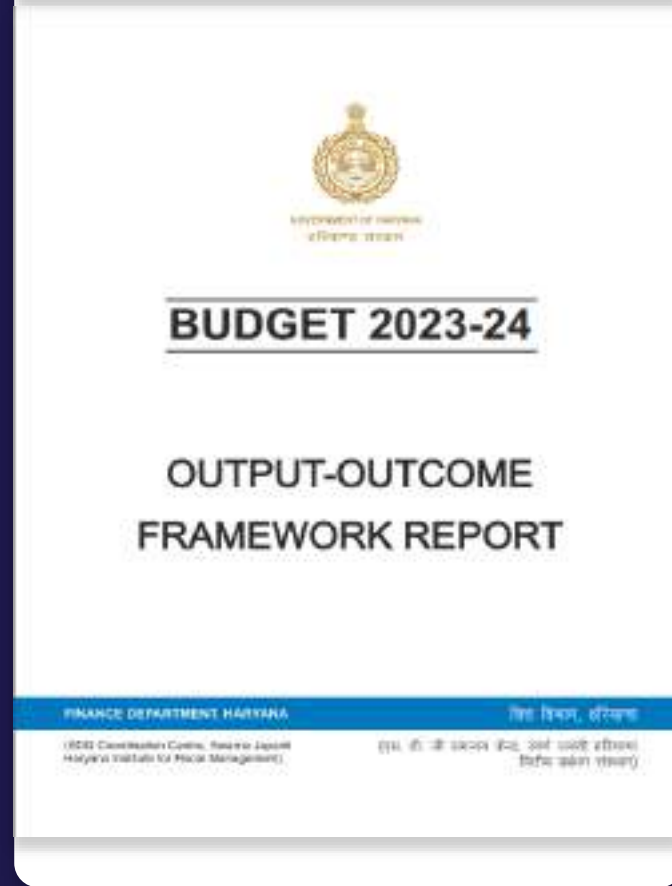

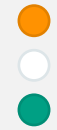
## SDG Budget Tagging

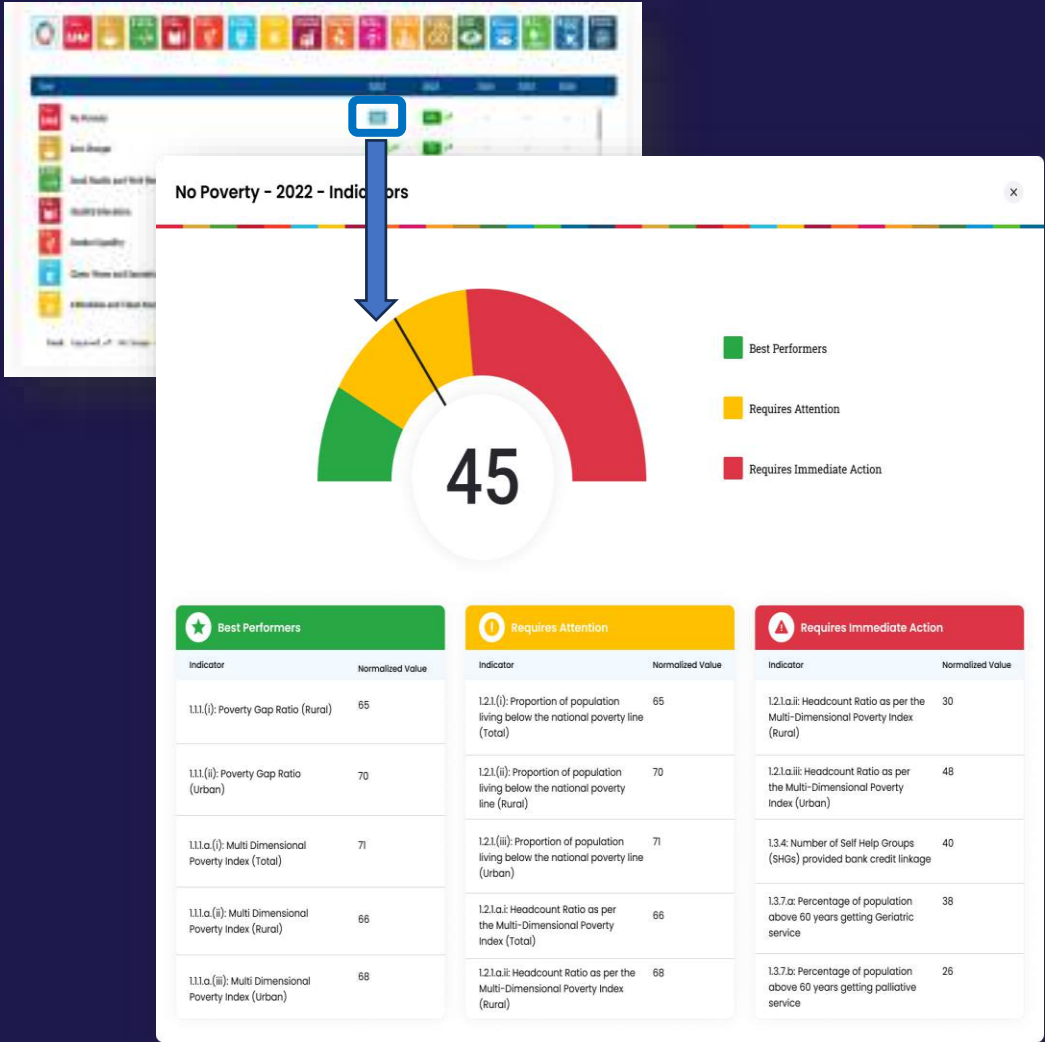
#### 1. Introduction

A new scheme, Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North-East Region (PM-DevINE) was announced in the Union Budget 2022-23. An initial allocation of Rs 1,500 crore was made along with an initial list of projects (**Annexure-A**).

- v. NITI Aayog and MDoNER, in collaboration with UNDP, have prepared the NER District SDG (Sustainable Development Goal) Index (Baseline Report 2021-22), which inter-alia points the SDG gaps at district level in the Region. This Report (and its updates) would increasingly be used for project identification and formulation under PM-DevINE. The Concept Paper/ Notes of proposed projects would invariably include justification of the project also in terms of the identified SDG gaps.

- Designing a clear institutional architecture, such as the SDG coordination centers at decentralized levels
- Monitoring frameworks at national, state, and district levels with reliable, disaggregated data for evidence-based decision-making
- Aligning budgets with the SDGs to assess whether tangible outcomes are achieved
- Investing in SDG capacities for the private sector and CSOs alongside the government
